All acts of HIB reported verbally to Principal on the day it occurs When the Principal receives a verbal report of alleged HIB, the Principal will contact and inform parents of all students involved Day 1 on the day the alleged act is first reported. Day 2 Within 2 days a written report must be given to Principal (N.J.S.A. 18A:37-15(b) (5) from the informing party

A Board of Education member, school employee, contracted service provider, student, or volunteer who has witnessed or has reliable information shall report an HIB incident to the School Principal, Anti-Bullying Specialist (DP/Mrs. Piernik or FD/Ms. Pearson) or any administrator who shall immediately initiate the school district procedures.

Day 2 Within 1 school day of the verbal report of the incident, the Principal shall inform the Anti-Bullying Specialist. The investigation through Day shall be conducted by Anti-Bullying Specialists (Mrs. Piernik at DP or Ms. Pearson at FD). The investigation shall be completed no 10 later than 10 school days from the date of written report. Up to Day Results of investigation shall be reported to the Superintendent within 2 school days of the completion of the investigation. 12

Results of investigation shall be reported to Board of Education no later than the date of the next Board of Education meeting meeting following the completion of the investigation.

Next BOE 5 days 5 school days after the results of the investigation are reported to the Board of Education, parents of the students who are after BOE
