#### RUMSON SCHOOL DISTRICT SCHOOL COMMUNITY COVID-19 CONTAINMENT GUIDELINES

# Based on NJDOE/CDC COVID-19 Public Health Recommendations for Local Health Departments for K-12 Schools, August 13, 2020

Isolations and Quarantines are based on the NJDOH Timeframe for Self-Isolation/Quarantine Based on Testing Result & Updated COVID-19 Quarantine Timeframes12.3

#### Symptom Screening

- 1. Daily parent survey based on NJDOH/CDC guidance utilizing remote app prior to leaving home (by 7:45 AM)
  - a. Daily Screening includes symptoms and exposures listed in NJDOH/CDC Daily Screening for Students/Staff
- 2. Daily thermal screening upon arrival to school before entering the building (one of three school entrances)
- 3. Follow up screening by a school nurse in the quarantine room as needed.

# **Regional Risk Assessment**

- 1. Use of <u>NJDOH/CDC Regional Risk Matrix</u> in conjunction with the <u>NJDOH COVID-19 Activity Level Report</u> as guidance for school district decision-making. (<u>sample Activity Level Report</u>)
- 2. Other resources to manage risk assessment: Johns Hopkins Coronavirus Resource Center Harvard Global Health

Probable Case (Student or Faculty	<ul> <li>Follows NJDOH School Exclusion List</li> <li>Probable Case sent home</li> <li>Probable Case requires should not return to school until they have either received a negative viral test [PCR] or they have completed an isolation period of at least 10 days since symptom onset and at least 24 hours after resolution of fever without fever-reducing medication with symptom improvement.</li> </ul>	• Daily cleaning and disinfecting routines to be followed.

	"COVID-19 compatible symptoms" are defined as the following: <u>Two or more of the following symptoms:</u> chills, rigors/shivers, myalgia/muscle aches, headache, sore throat, nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, congestion/runny nose
	<ul> <li><u>One or more of the following symptoms:</u> fever, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, new loss of smell, new loss of taste</li> <li>Siblings of those in isolation or pending a PCR will remain on</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>quarantine until a negative PCR occurs with the sibling or until 14 days after the 10 day isolation period with 24 hours after resolution of symptoms.</li> <li>Pending COVID-19 PCR tests are considered a Probable Case and are</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>required to stay home, as are members of the household, until individual can return with a negative PCR</li> <li>Close contacts remain in school and require no quarantining.</li> <li>No letter sent to parents of close contacts to probable case</li> <li>No notification of Monmouth County Regional Health Commission No. 1</li> </ul>
Travel	<ul> <li>Required to quarantine for 14 days from day of return to New Jersey.</li> <li>Excludes travel to Pennsylvania, New York, or Delaware</li> </ul>

#### **Definitions**

- Confirmed Case: A person with a lab test confirming COVID-19
- Probable Case: A person with clinical symptoms of COVID-19 with known exposure to a confirmed case or pending COVID-19 test results
- Close Contact: A person who was within 6 feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes starting from 2 days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic clients, 2 days prior to positive specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated

# <u>Contact Tracing Information</u> (to be available to Monmouth County Regional Health Commission No. 1)

- 1. Contact information for person(s) who tested positive for COVID-19
- 2. The date the COVID-19 positive person developed symptoms (if applicable), tested positive for COVID-19 (if known), and was last in the building.
- 3. Types of interactions (close contacts, length of contact) the person may have had with other persons in the building or in other locations.
- 4. Names, addresses, and telephone numbers for COVID-19 positive person's close contacts in the school.

- 5. Any other information to assist with the determination of next steps.
- 6. Notify the school community as per protocol above.
- 7. Follow with cleaning and disinfecting as per protocol above.

# **School Closure Scenarios**

Full school closures only need to be made in the event of a significant community outbreak as guided by the NJDOH/CDC Closure Document.
